Snow is guaranteed in Ischgl from 23 November, when the Silvretta Arena opens with 239 kilometres of cross-border pistes from Ischgl to Samnaun. The daily ski pass is also your ticket to the concert and costs 85 Euro per person on the day of the event. Admission to the concert is included in the price of a valid ski pass for two or more days. She was first known for her onscreen talents, and soon after became a musical phenomenon for her remarkable vocal ability. With an audience of over 260 million on social media, Demi has established herself as a global sensation.

With over 45 billion streams earned worldwide, Demi has captivated audiences with her renowned powerhouse vocals and illustrious songwriting. She has also received two GRAMMY Award nominations, four Billboard Music Awards nominations and three Brit Award nominations for her work.
